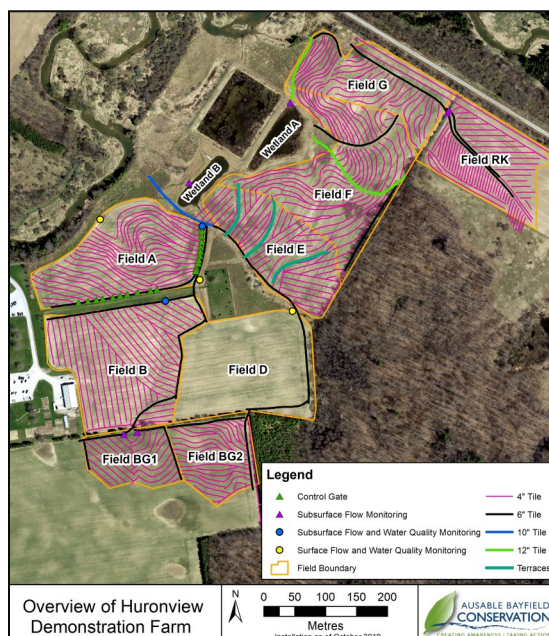
agriculture and water.
